We said that the bats of Bracken consume some "250 *million* tons of insects" each night. Bats are prodigious consumers of insects, but even they couldn't manage what would amount to about 12 and a half tons each! What we meant to say was "250 tons of insects," translating to about a half million pounds (as stated in the photo caption)--still an impressive quantity. As careful as we try to be, we'll be even more vigilant with our proofreading in the future.
