Volunteers Needed - Coconino National Forest, Arizona

Volunteers are needed in northern Arizona next summer to help graduate biologist Debra Bernardos locate maternity roosts of southwestern myotis (*Myotis auriculus*) and run an Anabat project comparing different forest types. Participants will be involved in mist-netting, radio telemetry, roost exit counts, Anabat recording, and creation of echolocation call libraries. Please note that only volunteers with pre-exposure rabies shots will be allowed to handle bats.

The project will begin in mid-June and continue through mid-August of 2000. Any amount of time volunteers can give, from a few days to a week or more, will be helpful. Those who do not wish to camp in the Coconino Forest can stay in a motel in Flagstaff (about an hour away).

If you are interested in gaining valuable bat research experience and seeing up to 15 different species of bats, please contact:
